Human Geographical Features

- In Nairobi, people live in houses and apartments. There are tall buildings, which are called skyscrapers.
- Nairobi also has many parks, museums, shopping malls and supermarkets. There is also a train station and an airport.
- Many tourists visit Nairobi. This means that there are lots of hotels for them to stay in.

Physical Geographical Features

- The climate is warm and temperate in Nairobi but there is a significant amount of rainfall during the year.
- - There is a wet season and dry season.
- Nairobi has many hills.
- There is a national park in Nairobi where there are giraffes and rhinos.
- The largest national park in Kenya is called the Maasai Mara. Its animals include lions, cheetahs, elephants, zebras and hippos. It is a three hour drive away from Nairobi.
