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What are Vertebrates?

Vertebrates are animals that have a backbone. There are five groups of vertebrates

Mammal - warm-blooded, give birth to live young, usually have hair or fur, cannot breathe underwater.

Fish - cold blooded, have fins and scales, breathe underwater using gills, lay eggs in water.

Bird - warm-blooded, have wings and beaks, have feathers, lay eggs

Reptile - cold-blooded, lay eggs, have scales, cannot breathe underwater

Amphibian - cold-blooded, lay eggs, live on land and water - can breathe underwater through gills

Animal	A living thing that feeds on plants or other animals
Mammals	A warm-blooded animal with fur.
Reptile	A cold-blooded animal that has dry, scaly skin.
Amphibian	A cold-blooded animal that can live in and out of water.
Fish	A cold-blooded animal that lives and breathes underwater. They have scaly skin.
Bird	A warm-blooded animal that has a beak, feathers and wings.
Herbivore	An animal that eats plants.
Carnivore	An animal that eats other animals.
Omnivore	An animal that eats plants and animals.
habitat	A habitat is a place where living things such as animals and plants can find all the things they need to survive.
