Bar and Bat Mitzvah

In their coming of age ceremony, Jewish children read in Hebrew from the Torah in the synagogue. They are then considered to be adults, with the responsibilities that that brings.



Sukkot

During Sukkot Jewish people remember the Exodus from Egypt. They build shelters to live in in memory of the 40 years God's people spent wandering the desert. Prayers are said to thank God for looking after them. The Four Kinds (a special selection of plants) are prayed over and waved in every direction.



Escape from Egypt

Moses leads the Israelites (God's people) from slavery in Egypt. They wandered the desert for 40 years in search of the Promised Land. The people made shelters, called Sukkahs, from palm leaves and branches. Moses was given the 10 commandments and God asked the Jewish people to live by these as their promise to him.

Creation

Genesis explains how God created the world in 6 days and rested on the seventh. Jewish people believe they have a duty to care for God's creation.



Key Vocabulary

Shabbat	The Jewish day of rest. This is the most important day in the week which begins on Friday and ends Saturday at sundown
Torah	A very important text for Jewish people which refers to the first five books of the Jewish Bible, or Books of Moses.
Rosh Hashanah	Also known as the Head of the Year; it is celebrated on the first and second days of the seventh month, Tishri, and is the Jewish New Year festival.
Synagogue	The place of worship for Jewish people
Passover	When Jews remember being led out of slavery by Moses.
Shofar Horn	Ritual musical instrument made from the horn of a ram or other animal.
Seder Plate	Symbolic plate used in Passover.
Menorah	A special lamp with 9 candles lit during Hanukkah.
Hankkuah	The Jewish festival of lights.

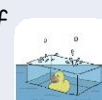
