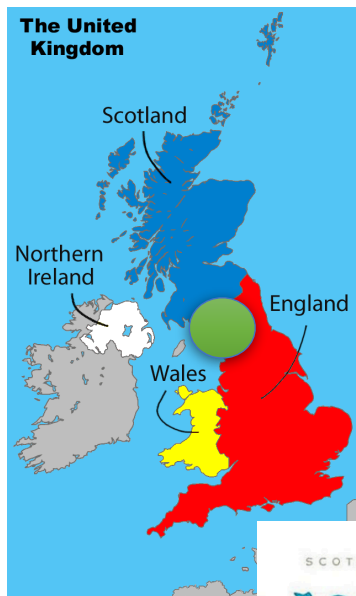




## Lake District

The Lake District is a National Park in the county of Cumbria in North-West England. It is the largest National Park in England. A National Park is a protected area of land, preserved for its natural beauty.

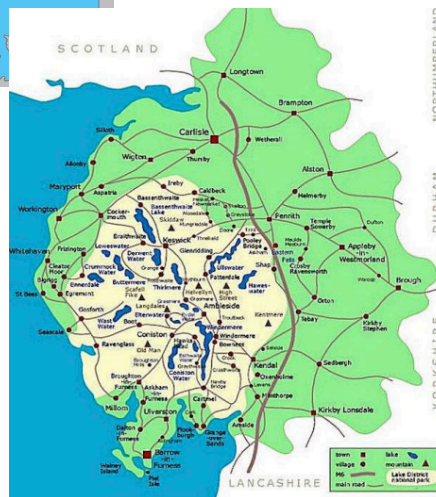
- The Lake District is home to over 16 bodies of water.
